The Catholic Foundation Presents Nearly \$850,000 in Grants at Fall Ceremony

Funding for scholarships, new buildings, education programs and more awarded to local schools, parishes and organizations

DALLAS – (Nov. 29, 2016) Nearly \$850,000 was awarded to 15 recipients at the 2016 Catholic Foundation Fall Grant Ceremony, held at Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church in Dallas. The grants will fund various projects including building and playground construction, Catholic high school scholarships, computers and software upgrades, and program and curriculum development.

Twice per year, The Catholic Foundation distributes community grants to local schools, parishes and nonprofit organizations. Grant requests are reviewed by the Board of Trustees' Distribution Committee, followed by documented site visits through which the recipients and funding amounts are determined. In 2015, The Catholic Foundation gave more than \$15 million through nearly 1,300 grants to 505 unique organizations in Dallas and across the country, with almost \$1.1 million granted through the spring and fall community grants. In 2016, through the end of September, the Foundation has made 1,000 grants totaling \$11 million.

"It is an honor to support the work these schools, parishes and organizations are doing in North Texas," said Matt Kramer, President and CEO of The Catholic Foundation. "Our ability to address the everchanging needs of the community would not be possible without our donors who create a legacy of giving through The Catholic Foundation. That legacy is what makes these grants and their incredible impact a reality."

Grants are made from the unrestricted Philanthropy Fund and restricted funds of The Catholic Foundation. Individuals or families, named or otherwise, establish restricted funds at the Foundation to benefit their communities today and for future generations. While impacting lives through the organizations they wish to support, donors benefit from the knowledge and expertise of professional Foundation staff, the maximum in tax benefits, and the assurance that the earnings from their investments will be utilized to further help their local Catholic community through the Philanthropy Fund.

In addition, a matching grant was awarded to St. Patrick Catholic Church in Denison following its recent establishment of a Parish Endowment Program (PEP) with the Foundation. This type of grant is offered to all Diocesan parishes that establish and fund a permanent endowment for the benefit of the parish at The Catholic Foundation.

Grants will also be awarded to support Catholic High School Scholarships (with partial Funding provided by The Catherine O'connell-Charles Schultz Endowment Fund & The Gene & Rita Cronin Scholarship Fund), and the Foundation's Work of Heart Award program, which honors local Catholic School employees.
