THE JETHSUBY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Why You Gave

After an 11-year-old Houston boy named Jethsuby died tragically in a traffic accident, Dr. Mauricio Delgado, a pediatric neurologist, and his wife, Maria, were touched by the fact that the boy's mother had expressed regret that she had not been able to afford a Catholic education for her son. So that other Hispanic children in need might get the education they deserve, the Delgados established The Jethsuby Scholarship Fund of The Catholic Foundation.

"We know what a Catholic education did for our children," Dr. Delgado said, "and we would like to help provide that same opportunity for others."

The scholarships will fund up to 50 percent of tuition costs in Diocesan Catholic elementary schools.

The Delgados have seeded the scholarship fund but intend to raise a total of \$1 million over the next two years from others who share their generous vision.

Our funds are professionally managed, carefully monitored, and independently audited; our grants are individually researched and assessed for effectiveness. Reports are provided to all donors through a secure online connection showing each donor's charitable activity. The Catholic Foundation has for 54 years – alone in the Diocese – excelled at translating the best of charitable instincts into enduring support for our Catholic churches, schools and services.

ENDURANCE

Once you establish your charitable intention with The Catholic Foundation, it can live forever. Many of our funding tools can be structured to continue to provide support for the people and causes you care about even after your death. And should a need be eliminated, or an agency cease to exist, The Catholic Foundation has the authority and flexibility to uphold your intention while putting your funding to work in an alternate, or more effective way. The Deacon Charles and Linda Stump Cathedral Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe Music Ministries Fund is a testamentary fund that will support the music ministries of the Cathedral Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe in Dallas, including the purchase of musical instruments, supplies and sheet music.

"Music has brought us great joy," Linda says. "And it gives us great comfort to know that we'll be helping music ministries even after we're gone."

THE LEON AND VICTORIA GULCZYNSKI ENDOWMENT FUND

Why You Gave

The charitable initiatives of the late Monsignor John Gulczynski include the Leon and Victoria Gulczynski Endowment Fund of The Catholic Foundation, which he named in honor of his mother and father. Monsignor hoped that with this legacy, he would be able to assist with the construction, expansion or maintenance of new or existing Catholic retirement facilities or nursing homes located within the Diocese of Dallas.

Since the inception of the fund in 2005 the result has been that The Catholic Foundation honored Monsignor Gulczynski's vision with grants totaling over \$1.1 million. During the past several years the Foundation has funded extensive renovations at Saint Joseph's Residence in the Oak Cliff neighborhood of Dallas. The efforts of Dallas businessman Dan Flaherty, along with St. Joseph's director,

Sister Adelaide Bocanegra, were instrumental in helping the Foundation align a pressing community need with the late Monsignor's charitable wishes.
