THE PHILANTHROPY FUND

You want to give what you can. But why should you write a check to The Catholic Foundation and not one directly to a charity?

A gift to The Catholic Foundation's Philanthropy Fund maximizes the impact of your philanthropy and will get your gift where it's needed most. For nearly 60 years, we have been deeply involved in identifying the most pressing needs of our community and in supporting the organizations that can respond to them. Your gift of any size adds to a significant fund that helps support churches, schools and nonprofit groups in need. The Foundation's trustees determine where the gift will do the most good, both in the present and in the future.



A Texas native, Bertha Moreno has been a devoted volunteer for Catholic and community causes for decades. She and her husband Herbert, a Korean War veteran, raised nine children, all of whom attended Bishop Dunne Catholic School.

A Registered Nurse, Bertha has worked in many parishes and at the Low Birth Weight Development Center in Dallas. While there, she learned firsthand about the impact of unrestricted gifts. "With those gifts," Bertha says, "you could pay for water, for electricity, for whatever you really needed." So after Herbert passed away, she decided to make a generous gift to

The Catholic Foundation's unrestricted Philanthropy Fund. "I am not a wealthy person by any stretch. But I have enough pennies and enough kids to take care of me. I knew with an unrestricted gift The Catholic Foundation would get the funds to the people in the schools, churches and nonprofits who run the organizations. They know what these organizations need. They know where it will do most good."



Doorway to Giving: DONOR ADVISED FUND

You give a significant amount already. But is there a better way to do it?

Offering optimal flexibility, a Donor Advised Fund is not dissimilar to a private or family foundation, but with significant tax advantages and considerably less complexity because it exists as part of a community foundation.

Contributions to – and distributions from – the fund can be made at any time in any amount. We work closely with you to support the causes and organizations most important to you. This vehicle for giving can be especially useful when you need to realize the benefits of a charitable tax deduction in a single year, while establishing a philanthropic program that extends over several years.





Long-time philanthropists and parishioners of St. Rita Catholic Church in North Dallas, Ed and Kathy Ramirez believe strongly in helping people in need. Ed is a retired CPA and financial executive for a large Canadian oil company. Kathy is a retired teacher who taught at Mary Immaculate Catholic School for eight years. She volunteers for organizations including Serra Club and Meals on Wheels. They originally had a Donor Advised Fund at a large national bank. "But most of our causes were Catholic- and community-related," Ed says. "So transferring to The Catholic Foundation made sense. They're


here. We know them. They know the community. They react quickly. Now it's all much easier. All I have to do is pick up the phone." Adds Kathy: "We have so many blessings to thank God for. We really want to give back." Through their fund, they support both Catholic and non-Catholic causes, including Montserrat Jesuit Retreat House and the Parkland Foundation (Ed serves on both boards).



Doorway to Giving: **PLANNED GIVING**

You've been giving to your parish for decades. But who's going to support your priorities after you're gone?

With a planned gift, you can continue to support causes and organizations you're passionate about and create a lasting legacy. Planned Giving through The Catholic Foundation uses gifts from your estate to fulfill your philanthropic vision in accordance with specific plans we make with you or you and your professional advisor. Vehicles include: Wills or Living Trusts, Charitable Remainder Trusts, Charitable Lead Trusts, Charitable IRAs, Charitable Gift Annuities, Life Insurance Policies and Life Estates. Instruments can be simple, or sophisticated enough to provide for an array of commitments to family, businesses, and charitable institutions.

their estate planning, the Wischmeyers
were inspired to act as though they had
one additional child. "We decided to treat
The Catholic Foundation as our fourth
kid," Mark says. "Through our will, we
are leaving a quarter of our estate to

the Foundation." Why? "Because we've been blessed and there are so many people in need. We know The Catholic Foundation understands the needs of the community."

The Wischmeyers are particularly passionate about helping equalize educational opportunities throughout Dallas, and they have supported many area schools, including St. Mary of Carmel School in West Dallas. "After we're gone, we want to continue to help others."

HOW TO BECOME A DONOR

Are you ready to realize your philanthropic intentions? Here are the basic steps The Catholic Foundation will guide you through:

Determine how much you wish to invest in philanthropy. Decide what you want to give now, in a gift to the Foundation's unrestricted Philanthropy Fund, to a Donor Advised Fund or Charitable Trust, and/or later, through a simple designation in a will or trust to establish a named charitable fund at the Foundation.

Name the fund and name the fund advisors.

Work with a Catholic Foundation professional to determine investment and spending policies for the fund.

Establish your fund with an initial gift and/or translate your charitable intentions into a lasting legacy through your will or trust.

CHARITABLE CAUSES

65.4% of our grants in 2012 went to educational causes, including grants to Big Thought for enrichment programming and to Holy Family of Nazareth Catholic School, St. Philip the Apostle Catholic School and St. Augustine Catholic School to enhance technology in the classroom.

22.7% of our grants in 2012 went to support religious causes, including repairs and renovations at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic Church, St. Monica Church, the Mount Carmel Center and the Montserrat Jesuit Retreat House.

11.9% of our grants in 2012 were awarded to charitable causes, including funds for a truck to be used by the Food Pantry at St. Bernard of Clairvaux Catholic Church in East Dallas and Catholic Charities for relocation cost of the Brady Center.

In 2012, The Catholic Foundation awarded more than \$4.7 million in grants from our unrestricted Philanthropy Fund, Restricted Funds, and Donor Advised Funds.
