The Catholic Foundation Awards \$1.1 Million During 2022 Spring Grant Ceremony

Grants will fund wide range of needs for local churches, schools and nonprofit organizations



DALLAS – The Catholic Foundation awarded \$1.1 million to 22 local schools, churches and community organizations during its 2022 spring grant ceremony on April 28.

Funded by the Foundation's unrestricted Philanthropy Fund as well as funds established by individuals and families to carry out their charitable goals, the grants will support various projects including HVAC replacements, facility renovations, senior services expansion, tuition assistance and technology upgrades for school classrooms.

"We are grateful to both our board and our donors for all they do to help The Catholic Foundation support local churches, schools and nonprofit organizations through these grants," said Matt Kramer, president and

CEO of The Catholic Foundation. "Each spring and fall, The Catholic Foundation provides grants to fund crucial projects that allow us to facilitate charitable giving and philanthropy in our community."

Twice per year, The Catholic Foundation distributes community grants to local Catholic churches and schools and nonprofit organizations. Grant requests are reviewed by the Board of Trustees' Distribution Committee, followed by documented site visits by Trustees through which the recipients and funding amounts are determined.

Over time, The Catholic Foundation has provided more than \$247 million in grants to religious, charitable and educational organizations. In 2021, The Catholic Foundation awarded 2,400 grants totaling more than \$21.5 million.

The tuition assistance recipients received funding from the Louise Emma Buhrer Endowment Fund and the Dorothy Irving Memorial Fund. The 2022 spring grant recipients are as follows:
