Before he turned 16, Raul had worked 9 different jobs in the Dallas area. With dedicated mentors and Raul's great attitude, he was working for himself as an entrepreneur by the age of 26 and has been ever since. There are now multiple locations of his restaurants, Las Ranitas and Los Sapitos. He began his construction business by building and finishing out new restaurants as well as building and financing homes for his employees.

A restaurateur, construction business owner and real estate developer, Raul utilizes all his skills and connections to help those in need. He has saved the Diocese millions of dollars by participating and managing construction projects at St Mary of Carmel, Our Lady of Perpetual Help School, Saint James Parish, Cristo Rey High School, Catholic Charities Dallas, St Jude Center and more. Whether new construction or restoration projects, his team provides excellent work efficiently and effectively. Their talent can be seen throughout the Dallas area.

In addition to his commitments to parishes and local Catholic schools, he is a founding board member of Cristo Rey Dallas and served as a trustee of The Catholic Foundation for six years.
