With the season of graduation just behind us, and the anticipation of a new school year less than two months away, I've thought a lot about education lately.

As you know, Catholic school education is very important to The Catholic Foundation.

It's why I'm so pleased that The Catholic Foundation since 2018 has given \$1.7 million in tuition assistance

and scholarship grants to 75 different schools ranging from elementary to college, helping hundreds of young people receive a Catholic education.

Over the past six years in my role here, I've seen first-hand how tuition assistance enables young people in elementary, middle and high school to receive a Catholic education that they might not otherwise have been able to experience without financial support.

One of our recent Hal Tehan Scholar Award (formerly the Catholic Foundation Scholar Award) winners recently said that his Catholic education served as his rock and base.

After he graduates from college and enters the professional world, the same young man aspires to help raise funds for others to enjoy a Catholic education.

Another student, and a former recipient of a Jethsuby Scholarship Fund of The Catholic Foundation, said his Catholic education helped him grow in mind, body and soul.

That student, an altar server and youth catechist on Sundays at his parish, encourages others to set high goals and work hard to achieve dreams with faith as the core.

Our community is better because of young students like these two high achievers who have been positively impacted by The Catholic Foundation.

The two scholars speak with passion, and a lot of their enthusiasm should be directed toward tireless educators.

Being an educator can be highly satisfying, but far too many teachers, as well as administrators and other

employees at Catholic schools aren't thanked enough.

Through our Work Of Heart program, now in its 15th year, we intentionally seek to honor the great work of selfless role models in our Catholic schools. You'll see stories in this edition about the recipients of Work Of Heart awards this past school season as well as our spring grant and tuition assistance recipients.

To them, all other past recipients, and to every person who enriches Catholic education, I offer my gratitude for your noble work. The influence and impact you have on students will make a lasting impact for decades to come.

A Year On The Plaza Artist Competition

Who wouldn't love seeing their artistic talent displayed on a giant public space in downtown Dallas?

If you are a professional artist, or have a friend or family members who is one, we're inviting top talent to participate in our 14th annual A Year On The Plaza artists competition.

The Catholic Foundation hosts this unique competition to identify a piece of original artwork to adorn a 28-foot-long by 9-foot-wide art wall in the Dallas Arts District for one year.

Works must be appropriate for the location of the Art Plaza on the grounds of the Cathedral Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe,

but do not require a religious theme. There are no entry fees, and the winning artist receives a \$2,500 stipend. Honorable mentions are also recognized with a \$250 award.

The submission deadline is August 22, and entry guidelines are available on our website at www.catholicfoundation.com/Get-Involved/Events-Calendar/A-Year-on-the-Plaza-Art-Competition. A panel of highly respected members of the local arts community will determine the winning piece that will be installed and unveiled this October.

Giving 101

A Simple Planning Tool

It's easy, you can have more than one, provides an income stream, it lasts throughout your lifetime, immediate tax deduction, it's flexible...Do you know about Charitable Gift Annuities?

The gift annuity has proven to be a very successful planned giving tool for over 200 years. Gift annuities have provided donors with the funds necessary for daily life or to supplement retirement income.

Many Donors are attracted to charitable gift annuities because they are simple – both easy to understand and easy to execute. In some cases, they are an economical

alternative to more complex charitable giving vehicles.

A Charitable Gift Annuity is a contractual arrangement whereby, in exchange for an irrevocable gift of cash, marketable securities (often long-term appreciated stock) or other readily marketable property, The Catholic Foundation will contractually agree to pay one or two designated annuity beneficiaries a fixed amount every year for the rest of the beneficiary's life (or lives).

This charitable giving tool is part charity and part annuity purchase. At The Catholic Foundation, the minimum to purchase a charitable gift annuity is \$10,000.

Our Catholic community ultimately benefits from a gift of this type while simultaneously

the Donor secures a tax deduction and a guaranteed income stream for life.

The Foundation will issue charitable gift annuities using the annuity rate published by the American Council on Gift Annuities. To conform to state law, the Foundation will always offer the maximum annuity rate to each potential donor/annuitant, based on the actual age of the annuitant. Payments may begin within one year of the gift date, or the payment stream may be deferred to begin later, in which case the payments are higher.

Power of endowments & Value of Catholic education

Local Catholic students who will benefit from tuition assistance announced at our spring grant ceremony never met Louise Buhrer. But the influence of the 1935 graduate of Ursuline Academy weighs large in their lives.

The reason is that Buhrer, who never married or had children, used her sharp vision to establish a charitable remainder trust at The Catholic Foundation in the 1990s.

After her passing, the fund started paying out in 2001 one-third to Ursuline, one-third to the elderly and one-third to tuition assistance for Catholic elementary schools.

Since 2001, Buhrer's endowment has granted out more than \$2.5 million. Today, it's worth almost \$10 million.

During The Catholic Foundation's spring grant ceremony, 10 local Catholic schools received tuition assistance funded by either the Louis Buhrer Endowment and/or the Dorothy Irving Memorial Fund. Irving placed a \$1 million bequest in her will to support medical research and education.

Gail Richardson-Bassett, principal of Good Shepherd Catholic School in Garland, spoke on behalf of the schools that received tuition assistance at the spring grant ceremony, and described the value of a Catholic education.

"A Catholic education is not affordable for many families. When we look at our budgets and the money that we have to spend it is very real. So many students would be turned away if we could not find a way to fund them. Thanks to the awards we are receiving today, we will be able to provide tuition assistance for many students.

"It's always wonderful when we go back to our schools and we can call families and tell them that they will be able to keep their children in our schools. It also helps for our new families who've always wanted the gift of a Catholic education but could not afford it.

"The one thing The Catholic Foundation members probably don't realize is the wonderful thanks that we get for these awards. When we meet with families and they find out they are going to be able to keep their children in our schools or bring them to our schools for the first time, there are always tears of joy, and thankful hugs, and if we're really lucky, a dozen tamales!

"We get to really appreciate the gift that this is giving them because we see the smiles on their faces. We see the little children come to school all happy and excited to be part of our Catholic communities.

"On behalf of all of our schools, please know how very grateful we are for these awards. And on behalf of the students and the families that will receive these awards, we thank you very much for making a difference."

WORK OF HEART AWARDS RECOGNIZE EXCEPTIONAL CATHOLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES

For 15 years, The Catholic Foundation has honored hundreds of Catholic school employees who go above and beyond to display outstanding service, model a Christian example and support students, families and our Dallas-area community.

Known as the Work Of Heart Award, each teacher, administrator or staff member at a Catholic elementary, middle or high school in the community receives public recognition, a certificate and a \$500 cash award.

“Work Of Heart recipients don’t just inspire local Catholic school children, but they are champions for our entire community,” said Anne Nicol who administers the Work Of Heart program at The Catholic Foundation.

During the 2018-19 school year, 64 Dallas-area Catholic School employees were honored with a Work of Heart Award during presentations at school Masses or student assemblies.

\$1.16 MILLION AWARDED DURING SPRING GRANT CEREMONY
